

## Changes to Non-Special Admit and First-Time Non-Special Admit Cohort Student Metrics in the 2025 DataVista Release 2.0

March 13<sup>th</sup>, 2025

This document describes any differences in Non-Special Admit or First-Time Non-Special Admit Cohort student metrics resulting from the integration of 2023-24 academic year data for the 2025 Release 2.0.

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## Changes to Labeling and Regions in DataVista

## Changes to Disaggregations

### Shifts in Gender and Race/Ethnicity Subgroups (103 and 104)

#### Asian and Filipino

An issue has been fixed which incorrectly flagged Filipino students as Asian bringing the values for both student groups closer to the values in the Student Success Metrics snapshot and cohort views in LaunchBoard.

*Impact:* Statewide values for Non-Special Admit Asian students are lower by 14% to 19% depending on the year. Statewide values for First-Time Non-Special Admit Asian students are lower by 5% to 22% depending on the year. Filipino student counts are higher by nearly the exact same number as the reduction in Asian students for both of these student groups.

#### Multiple Values Reported

An issue with Multiple Values Reported has been fixed resulting in lower values with increased values for Unknown or other subgroups for Gender and Race/Ethnicity in some instances at the multi-college district, microregion, macroregion, or statewide levels.

*Impact:* Statewide values for Non-Special Admit multiple values reported students both in the snapshot and cohort views for Race/Ethnicity are lower with other subgroups higher.

### **All Other Values for Secondary Gender Disaggregation in the Cohort View**

The issue above for the fix to inflated counts for Multiple Values Reported led to a decrease in the number of students included in the All Other Values secondary gender subgroup since that generated category includes non-binary, unknown, and multiple values reported.

*Impact:* Statewide values for All Other Values for nearly all primary disaggregations in nearly all years are lower with female and male values higher for nearly all primary disaggregations in nearly all years.

### **Economically Disadvantaged (106)**

GT Basic Needs Grant was added in 2022 and G2 Homeless and Housing Insecurity Program (HHIP) Grant was added in 2024 to [SF21 Student-Aid-Award-Type](#). Both of those values have been added to the definition for Economically Disadvantaged.

*Impact:* Statewide values for Economically Disadvantaged students are just slightly higher starting in 2021-22. For the students who started in the 2022-23 cohort, values are higher by 1.3%.

### **Age for Applicants from CCCApply (340)**

An issue has been addressed to more accurately capture the age of applicants from CCCApply leading to a shift to all other age categories from 50 or older, which includes students who are not in other predefined age groupings.

*Impact:* The number of 50 or older students is lower by 0.4% to 19% for both applicants in the snapshot view and first-time applicants in the cohort view depending on the year. All other age categories are slightly higher.

## **Changes or Updates to Metrics**

### **Successful Enrollment in the cohort View (300C)**

A fix to an issue to better capture CCCApply students and their outcomes has increased the number of applicants who successfully enrolled in the cohort view.

*Impact of the change:* The statewide value for the Successful Enrollment metric is 14% higher in 2014-15 and drops down to 2% in 2022-23.

### **Number of Cohort Students (122C)**

Some cleanup has been applied to the grade column in the table received for integration into DataVista to remove trailing spaces. With this fix, more students with MW and EW grades were flagged leading to slightly lower counts of first-time cohort students, especially in 2022-23.

*Impact of the change:* Statewide cohort counts are very slightly lower for all years with the number of students who started in 2022-23 lower by 1.1%.

### **Students Who Earned Noncredit Certificates in the snapshot view (604S)**

A resubmission of [SP02 Student-Program-Award](#) data by City College of San Francisco has increased the number of students who earned noncredit certificates.

*Impact:* Statewide values are higher by 3% to 9% for 2020-21 through 2022-23.

### **Students Attained Apprenticeship Journey Status (610S)**

As of 02/27/25, WestEd had not received the Department of Apprenticeship Standards data for integration into DataVista. Therefore, there is no data displayed for this metric for 2023-24. We are hoping to receive and integrate this file before public release.

### **Students Who Earned a Degree or Certificate or Attained Apprenticeship Journey Status (632S)**

As of 02/27/25, WestEd had not received the Department of Apprenticeship Standards data for integration into DataVista. We are hoping to receive and integrate this file before public release. So, this metric does not capture those students who attained apprenticeship status in 2023-24.

### **Four-Year Transfer Metrics (614, 615, 616, 620C, 650)**

All four-year transfer metrics in both the Non-Special Admit snapshot and first-time cohort view are slightly higher due to an increased number of records included. At the time of release, we do not have an explanation for the increase.

*Impact:* Statewide values are higher by as much as 1% depending on the year and the metric.

### **Became Employed in the snapshot view (700S)**

The denominator for this metric Exiting Students Who Were Unemployed Before Entry or Reentry (208S) is much lower for 2014-15 impacting the value and the percentage. The Chancellor's Office has decided to suppress the display of this metric for 2014-15 until we can fully understand what looks like changes in the underlying EDD UI wage file for earlier years impacting this metric.

*Impact:* Statewide values are lower by 37% with the denominator lower by 25% and the percentage lower by 4 basis points in 2014-15. The later years are only minimally impacted.

### **COLA Update Impacting Earnings Metrics in the snapshot view (800S, 801S, 802S)**

The annual update to cost-of-living adjustment index always impacts the Median Annual Earnings, Median Change in Earnings, and Living Wage metrics.

*Impact:* Statewide Median Annual Earnings (800S) are higher by 3%. The impact on Median Change in Earnings (801S) and Attained the Living Wage (802) is similar but is complicated by the issues listed below for those two metrics.

### **Median Change in Earnings in the snapshot view (801S)**

With the likely changes in the underlying EDD UI wage file for earlier years mentioned above, the denominator for this metric Exiting Students Who Were Employed After Exit and Before Entry or Reentry (510S) is higher leading to lower percentages. The Chancellor's Office has decided to suppress the display of this metric for 2014-15 until we can fully understand what looks like changes in the underlying EDD UI wage file for earlier years impacting this metric.

*Impact:* Statewide median % change in earnings are lower by 0 to 5 basis points depending on the year.

### **Attained the Living Wage in the snapshot view (802S)**

The source of the living wage for a single adult at the county level from the [Self-Sufficiency Standard for California 2024](#), Center for Women's Welfare, University of Washington has been updated with 2024 data. To align with the Student Centered

Funding Formula, the living wages used for the calculation of this metric have been updated from 2021 to 2024.

*Impact:* Statewide values are lower by 26% to 27% with differences by macroregion depending on the year:

- Bay Area is down by 15% to 16%.
- Central/Mother Lode is down by 21% to 28%.
- Inland Empire is down by 35% to 41%.
- Los Angeles is down by 29% to 31%.
- Orange County is down by 23% to 28%.
- North/Far North is down by 23% to 26%.
- San Diego/Imperial is down by 32% to 34%.
- South Central Coast is down by 27% to 31%.

Differences between 2021 and 2024 living wages by county can be found in the Appendix below.

## **Changes to Data Visualizations in DataVista**

### **Updates to Vision 2030 Report**

Added Goal Not Yet Defined to the Status Definition on Overall Progress page for the Vision 2030 report since the new metric 621 Transfer to a Non-Profit Private Independent does not have a goal for Vision 2030.

Updated the calculation for Outcome 4 EITHER as (a) increase by 25% OR (b) increase to pre-pandemic levels to whichever goal is greater. The method to determine the goal is included in the hover over text on the graph.

### **Update to Top 5 in Single Metric View**

The ability to toggle between percent and count for most metrics is available for all student groups.

### **Updates to SWP and Guided Pathways Reports**

All metric titles appear in the Strong Workforce Program and Guided Pathways reports even when no data is available for the year selected. In addition, information has been added to the left navigation informing users which metrics are not yet available and need additional years of data to calculate.
